

FAQs

What is the tournament format?

Date: Thursday 7 September – Saturday 9 September 2023

Field: 108 Players

Format:

The tournament will be a 54-hole stroke play event.

The field will play one round on each of the first two days, after which the leading 45 players (and those who tie for 45th place) will go forward to the final round.

In the event of a tie for the first place there will be a hole-by-hole play-off.

Prize Presentation

The Prize Presentation will be held on the 18th green immediately after play on Saturday 9 September

Prize fund

EURO 70,000

Pro-Am

This will take place on Wednesday 6 September.

The Pro-Am Draw will be published on Golf Genius and can be accessed via the App using the GGID (see @roseladiesgolf for the code closer to the day).

Is the tournament on television?

A 1-hour highlights programme on the Rose Ladies Open will be on SKY SPORTS GOLF and SKY SPORTS GOLF YOUTUBE approximately 1 week after the tournament.

Tickets

The Rose Ladies Open is **FREE** to enter, but you must register for a ticket. See the ticket button on the website for how to register. Please bring your PDF ticket confirmation (printed or on your device) with you to the event where you will be given a wristband to allow you access to the tournament.

Travel & Parking

FREE event parking on site.

For directions to venue, please use the post code AL8 7XG for Sat Nav.

Designated parking for Blue Badge holders is located in the main car park. For those with accessibility issues who require parking on site, please email sonia@rosegolf.co.uk

Bicycles

Bicycle parking will be available on site. Please ask the Car Parking attendants for directions upon arrival.

Bikes are left at your own risk, The Rose Ladies Open, Organisers, Venue and partners accept no liability in relation to theft or damage occurred.

Can I bring a child's buggy/pushchair?

Yes you can. However please be aware of uneven terrain. Children should always be accompanied by an adult.

The ground is uneven and particularly under wet conditions the ground may become slippery therefore appropriate footwear should be worn to avoid injury.

Are dogs permitted to the tournament?

Dogs are not permitted at the tournament with the exception of trained assistance guide dogs, and we respectfully suggest that you do not leave your pet in the car.

Can I bring a bag / rucksack?

Bags and rucksacks are permitted at the tournament and there are no restrictions on size. For your safety, security bag searches may be in operation on entry.

Clothing and What to Wear

We would recommend that you wear casual clothing. The ground is uneven and particularly under wet conditions, it may become slippery therefore appropriate footwear should be worn to avoid injury. Please check the weather forecast before setting off on your journey.

Spectator's behaviour & safety

- Please remain still for each shot and do not move until all the Players in the group have played or holed out.
- Please kneel or sit down if you are in the front row. Consider other spectators when using an umbrella.
- Please do not distract the players while they are on the course.
- Please keep behind the ropes and barriers on the course and use the official crossing points.
- Please walk, don't run, and obey the course marshals – they are trying to make your day more enjoyable.
- Please dress accordingly for the weather conditions. Sensible shoes should be worn. No metal spikes allowed.
- Please listen to any public address announcements and follow instructions from officials and volunteers should they be necessary.

Inclement Weather

We will notify spectators as soon as possible should inclement weather be moving into the area. Spectators are advised to take precautions PRIOR to play being suspended. If the siren sounds, seek shelter immediately, avoiding the following: Open areas, Hilltops or high places, Isolated trees, Golf buggies and Wire fences

Evacuation Procedure

If it is necessary to evacuate the site, please follow the instructions of the course marshals, volunteers and event officials in an orderly fashion.

Marshals

The Chief Marshal and their team will be in a number of key locations at the venue, the purpose of the Marshals is to ensure that the competitors are able to compete under the best conditions. Please do listen to any instructions given by marshals, they are for your safety and enjoyment of the tournament.

Smoking Policy

Smoking is not permitted in/on any structure.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones are permitted, but please ensure they are on silent mode when on the course.

The making of or distribution of broadcasts, commentary, news reports, data, results or statistics by any means in any format or media including any such by mobile phone or other wireless device is not permitted.

There aren't any phone charging stations at the venue, please remember to bring a portable phone power bank.

Contactless & Cash Payments

There will **not** be ATM's onsite, all catering units will accept both cash and contactless payments.

Accessibility

If you need a personal assistant to attend the event with you, please register them for a **FREE** ticket too via the ticket system.

Are wheelchairs allowed on site at the Championship?

Wheelchairs and other motorised chairs are allowed at the venue.

A dedicated wheelchair viewing area will be positioned beside the 18th grandstand.

Accessible toilet facility locations are located within the clubhouse, please ask a member of staff or marshal for directions to the nearest facility.

Rose Ladies Open Tournament Office

The Tournament Office is located close to the clubhouse. This is also the location for information and lost property.

Information Centre

The Rose Ladies Open Tournament Office is also the Information Centre, it is located at number ?? on the map.

Please also familiarise yourself with the location of First Aid stations and refreshment areas ahead of travel.

On entry to the venue, look for a map board, this will help you find exits, key facilities and provide other key information.

Medical First Aid

Full medical and first aid facility is on site. If you need medical assistance whilst out on course, please ask a marshal or event official who can radio for assistance.

Lost Property

Lost property that has been found can be handed in to the nearest marshal, volunteer or event official. All items will be delivered to the Rose Ladies Open Tournament Office at the end of each day.

Practice

The practice range including putting green and shot game area for the tournament will be located at the Venue's main range facility – see site map for exact location.

Seating on course

There are seating areas located in the Village close to the food outlets and at the on course refreshment area by the 2nd green.

Grandstands

There is a Free Spectator grandstand by the 18th green.
Sit and enjoy the action.

Please note that on certain days, some of the seats in the Grandstand will be reserved for certain guests / partners / sponsors.

NO SMOKING in the grandstands. Alcohol will be permitted on the grandstand at the tournament. Spectators are kindly asked not to stand up on the stands during play.

A dedicated wheelchair viewing area will be positioned at the side of the 18th grandstand.
